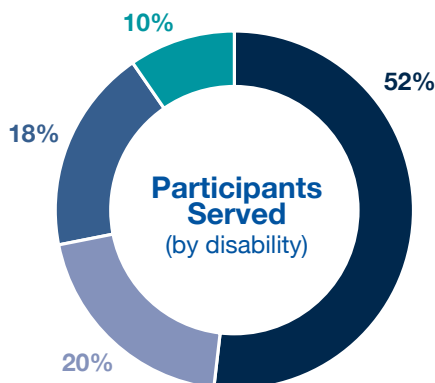

OUR HISTORY

- 1959** ● City National Bank's Leonard L. Abess and Roy A. Perry, along with James A. Ryder, launched Goodwill South Florida. John S. and James L. Knight provided their first downtown headquarters.
- 1965** ● Launched the Adult Day Training program to provide services to individuals with developmental disabilities through a partnership with the State of Florida Development Disability Services.
- 1982** ● Formed a Service Contract Division to employ people with disabilities in well-paid jobs, helping hundreds of individuals with disabilities secure employment.
- 1994** ● Created the Apparel Manufacturing Division, becoming the first nonprofit in America to manufacture technically complex garments while employing people with disabilities.
- 2024** ● Celebrated 65 years of transforming lives in South Florida.



A Closer Look

AT GOODWILL SOUTH FLORIDA...

- We operate a unique social enterprise through our Mission Services and six businesses.
- Our Mission Services prepare individuals with disabilities and barriers to work for employment.
- Our Goodwill Businesses provide direct employment opportunities. Every year, our social enterprise generates upwards of \$200 million with 95% of costs allocated towards carefully crafted, mission-focused programs.

...AND THERE IS MORE

- We operate over 85 retail stores, outlets, and donation centers across South Florida.
- Today, the Ryder Apparel Manufacturing Program is regarded as a top combat and non-combat apparel manufacturer for the Department of Defense and a supplier of interment flags for the Department of Veterans Affairs. In the last year, we produced more than 750,000 garments and flags.
- Our Service Contracts division oversees one of the region's largest custodial and janitorial businesses, cleaning over 5 million square feet nightly. This includes 150 government, military, and commercial buildings from Port St. Lucie to Homestead.
- In 2013, we opened our state-of-the-art commercial laundry facility in Liberty City, the area's most significant economic revitalization project. It can process 40 million pounds annually and supports the Baptist and Jackson health systems.
- As one of the country's original recyclers, Goodwill is responsible for leading the conversation around repurposing, waste reduction, and sustainability. Our programs famously give used goods new life, resulting in 54 million pounds of waste diverted from our local landfills yearly.
